

100km Route Description and Power Stations

The JUST BIKE 100km route provides a great variety of terrains and scenery and is the perfect way to experience the broad and sweeping landscapes of the Ridgeway and Wessex.

For the first 9km the route starts by following quiet country lanes south from Coate Water Country Park going through the village of Badbury and going over the M4 before climbing up onto the Ridgeway heading East. This part of the route follows the ancient track and is rough in places and gently undulates, expect some muddy and rutted patches! The route continues along the Ridgeway until near Wantage then the route drops down off the hills and the first power Station is here at Yew Dow after 28km's (We will offer a water top-up along the Ridgeway at 13km's for those that need it).

A few km's after the first power station the route leaves the Ridgeway and heads South along bridal paths and lanes towards the village of West Ilsley and past Peasmore, potential for some muddy sections through here. Just after the village of Peasmore at Hillgreen Common is the second power station after 42km's. The route continues along more country lanes and trails past the villages of Leckhampstead and Boxford. Nearing Newbury we reach the 45km mark where we stop heading south and start heading west coming to the third power station at Kintbury around 65km's. After this the route heads west along quiet lanes following the old London to Bath coach road to Ramsbury. We use a hall here for the fourth and final power station at 80km's. The route then takes on some more rough tracks passing over the hills to Ogbourne St George. From here the route joins the old railway line cycle route for an easy few miles heading north towards Swindon and the finish at Coate Water country park.
